Register to vote online at MyVote.wi.gov.

- Or register to vote before the election by mail, at your municipal clerk’s office, or at your polling place on Election Day.
- Don’t forget your Proof of Residence document.

Request an absentee ballot at MyVote.wi.gov or ask your clerk for an absentee ballot application.
You must have an acceptable Photo ID to vote.
